The situation is worse for already disadvantaged and susceptible groups especially the youth in the urban slums like Korogocho.

Elections provide a singular opportunity for citizens to reaffirm their values, commitment and quest for a better society. In our case, we hope to reinforce and expand the role of youth in decision making before, during and post elections. The project will concentrate in Kasarani constituency and will cover at least six wards in the area including Korogocho.

## Youth issues

One of the main concerns is that youth form about 60% of the Kenya population, yet they are excluded and at times exclude themselves from decision making table. Consequently, they form the largest statistics of the poor and those affected by poverty related factors like HIV/Aids, human rights violations and so on.

Further, they are faced with a multitude of stereotypes that deny them opportunity and support to articulate their issues and to implement them. It is against this background that Miss Koch Initiative is inviting all youth who reside in Kasarani to attend youth

TAKA Taka Afya Korogocho (TAK), one of the largest and oldest community based organization in Korogocho shall be unveiling their new leaders in a grand swearing in ceremony that shall be attended by hundreds of people including the TAK trustees on August 18<sup>th</sup> 2007 as from 2pm at the Korogocho Community Center's main hall.

"We want to set a precedent through the swearing in ceremony in which the new TAK officials could be held accountable to TAK members while ensuring that there is transparency, commitment and honesty in their work," explains Mr. Francis Wainaina, the TAK chairman elect.

The new leaders who shall be sworn in are: Mr. Francis Wainaina (chairman), Nancy Kamau (vice chairperson), Francis Mulimba (Secretary), Francis Kinyati (Vice secretary), Wilfrida Ojwang (Treasurer), Pastor Elly Ochieng (Organizing secretary),

Margaret Obunga (Head of women and children department), Grace Mbuchi (Environment), Francis Njoroge (Tools and contract), Cecilia Wambui (Education and culture), Esther Wambui (Dispute), Florence Anyoso (Welfare), Suleiman Kungu (Male youth representative), Margaret Wambui(Female youth representative) and Cecilia Wanjiru(Projects).

"The previous officials were just sleeping on the jobs while others embarked on massive misappropriation of TAK resources. We definitely had to weed them out," says John Kahihu, TAK Nyayo village committee secretary.

The vote of no confidence was passed by the TAK governing council on March 30<sup>th</sup> 2007 and by elections duly carried out as per the constitution on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

"Korogocho residents are anxiously waiting for the new leaders to turn around TAK into a once more robust community based organization," claims Anne Wachira, a TAK day care mother.
